

Mentoring Program Terms and Conditions of Participation

The National Register Mentorship Program is intended to help connect mentees with potential mentors. By voluntarily participating in this program, Mentors and Mentees agree to the following:

- 1. The Program does not offer therapy, teaching, or supervision between the Mentee and Mentor. Any actions or decisions made by either the Mentor, the Mentee, or the National Register should not be construed as offering therapy, teaching, or supervision.
- 2. Conversations between the Mentor and Mentee are not intended to provide psychological services or advice to either party's clients.
- 3. Neither party will refer individuals to the other for services, nor will either party accept referrals from the other throughout the duration of the mentoring relationship.
- 4. Both the Mentee and Mentor agree to confidentiality in accordance with professional standards and will not disclose information outside the professional mentoring relationship, unless authorized by the other party. Nothing in this agreement prevents either party from pursuing a licensing board complaint or other legal action if they believe improper or illegal conduct has occurred.
- 5. The Mentee and Mentor agree to waive and release any and all claims against the National Register, its directors, officers, and employees, that relate to any action or inaction associated with the Program.
- 6. Mentor and Mentee agree to indemnify and hold the National Register and its employees, directors, and officers harmless from any claims, damages, expenses, or liabilities, including legal costs, that arise from their involvement in the Program.
- 7. Although the Program strives to match mentors and mentees successfully, not all pairings will be a good fit. The Mentor or Mentee may request a reassignment, subject to availability, or apply again in the future. The National Register reserves the right to remove any participant from the Program at its discretion.
